**<u>EMIS Collections</u>** - Several FY24 collections are closing soon, and we are in a transition window to begin FY25 reporting.

ODEW is encouraging districts to submit **FY25 SCR** data as soon as possible. The matching process for Child Nutrition Direct Certification (CNDC) purposes for Free/Reduced lunch determinations will begin sometime next week. This submission can also assist districts with student enrollment for the 24-25 school year, and getting summer withdrawal information entered/reported.

• **FY25 Retention/Promotion** collection opens soon and has a very short window (7/11/24 - 8/30/24). Data from this collection does impact this year's report card.

<u>College Credit Plus (CCP)</u> - ODEW is planning to pull **FY24 CCP data** this Friday, July 12, 2024. FY24 data is still paid in the fall - this is the first time the spring courses will be paid. The FY23 data has been frozen for a little while from a district and college perspective, but there are a few overrides Area Coordinators are finishing up this week from FY23. Please make sure the FY24 CCP data is submitted and reviewed for accuracy.

**<u>EMIS Manual</u>** - ODEW has started to post sections of the FY25 EMIS Manual. Some sections have been published already; the goal is to get everything that has gone through the public comments process posted by the end of this week. There are some FY25 changes still in that 90 day window process, so they cannot be posted until complete.

Level 2 Derived Reading Diagnostics Results (LTRC-001) - The June 20, 2024 Newsflash outlined report updates which impacted some students' derived results. There are still some districts reporting an incorrect assessment code for some of the iReady related assessments; this was outlined in the FAQ that was released. One more known issue ODEW is currently working on which impacts students who had a district relationship of 2 or 3 at the beginning of the year, but became a district relationship of 1 later in the year. These students would have 30 days to be assessed from the time they became district relationship of 1, but the process included the days before their status change, and the report was showing they were assessed beyond the 30 day window. Districts may also see students drop off the report who were educated elsewhere and generally don't count in a district's accountability. Some students will remain (one example would be BDD students) because the district is responsible for reporting the Reading Diagnostic score.

Overall things are looking pretty good, but there is still work to be done. This collection closes on 8/7/24, and is part of this year's Local Report Card > Early Literacy Component.

## <u>Q&A</u>

**Q:** How can we resolve the Grad-003 Potential College Credit report? For example, one student has 6 college courses on the report, but only 5 on the student's schedule. Is anyone else having issues resolving this report?

**A:** There are some things on this report that will never get resolved. For example, if a student fails a college course and doesn't earn credit, ODEW has no way of knowing this so that course will make it to the report, even though the student didn't get credit. Districts have more information than ODEW. The AP, IB and Articulated Agreement (Career Tech) related credits - districts will have to check with the student once they matriculate to see if they actually got credit for those courses. The matching, in terms of subject area from college matching to areas in which ODEW counts credit, is not a perfect science. A student, for example, may have taken 6 courses but one of those courses is counting in a different credit area than what ODEW expected it to count. That's ok - the district makes the decision on where to report it.
