

ODE EMIS Conference Call Summary

March 13, 2017

Items from David Ehle

- 1) Two appeal windows open that close March 15
 - a) March CTE Follow-Up to add missing students
 - b) KRA data appeals
 - c) Make sure requests are entered by this Wednesday
- 2) Starting to process March appeals to add students
 - a) Takes time because each request needs researched
 - b) Once students are added, there will be an 'Appeal' version of the file
 - c) Not mixed with the first file, so the appeal file can be added without issue
 - d) Appeal students will be added to the analysis file
 - e) Question: If district filed an appeal for March Follow-Up, once they are approved will they show up as a 003 file?
 - i) It will probably be a 003 file but will probably have 'Appeal' in the file name
 - ii) Will be added to the analysis file
 - iii) New file can be added to the EMISFFE without disturbing the original file that was loaded
 - iv) All records will be exported together to load into the data collector
 - f) Question: In the actual appeal process, since there are different types of appeals, Do they all have to be submitted in the same appeal or in separate appeals?
 - i) The recommendation is to do all types of appeal in one appeal file
 - ii) Don't believe a district can submit more than one appeal for an area, such as March CTE Follow-up
 - iii) All appeals must be filed by Wednesday March 15
- 3) ITC Training March 29
 - a) Three topics
 - i) Cherwell Training
 - ii) Training on new Data Collector
 - (1) Just about done with User Interface
 - (2) Finishing up permissions and user preferences
 - iii) New Tuition module in ODDEX
 - (1) Launching Tuition module hopefully by this Friday, March 17
 - (a) Information later this week about SAFE roles
 - (b) Superintendents and Treasurers will automatically have access
 - (i) Assistant Treasurers will have approve access also

- (ii) EMIS Coordinators will have Read-Only access
 - (c) New roles for approvals and read-only
 - (d) ITC staff with student level SDC access will have read-only access
- (2) Soft launch with communication from the Area Coordinator's office
 - (a) By the end of the 2nd Tradition window, need to have all students from July 1-December 31 correct
 - (b) 30-day review window that will start May 1
- (3) Question: Can you explain what these Tuition students are?
 - (a) How Received code of C, P, T, W (Foster/Court Placement, Other Court Placements, Non-court ordered institutional placement, Non-resident Title I public school choice)
 - (b) Educating district gets FTE dollars directly from ODE
 - (i) Tuitions laws allows districts to claim local dollars for time of placement
 - (ii) Tuition process is what transfers local dollars between districts
- (4) A new contact manifest that will collect parent address
 - (a) District can also manually add address information into the ODDEX
 - (b) Address needs to be where the parent resided at the time of placement which is most likely not where the student is
- (5) Question: The understanding was when this first discussed that the address where student resided at time of placement was going to be required. Is this now optional?
 - (a) An address is required
 - (b) It may be that the district reporting may not know so they can report Not Available
 - (c) The optional part is to use the address collection to submit the data
 - (i) They can enter it manually
 - (d) Entering court documents is also an optional part of this
 - (e) Can escalate tickets to ODE to Area Coordinator if districts can't agree with district of responsibility
 - (f) Hoping to put that escalation methodology into SOES, but that will take time
- 4) New EMIS Coordinator Training
 - a) Had one in August
 - b) Talked about having one geared for yearend reporting
 - c) April 6 and 10
 - d) Not in STARS yet, but will be this week
 - e) If ITC has new EMIS Coordinators that were in August training or new since August, let them know about the trainings
 - i) 3 Years or less

- ii) Repeat trainings so only need to register for one meeting
- 5) As part of tuition roll-out, there has been some changes to some of the validation tables
 - a) REF_DIST_BLDG table is out of sync for all but three ITCs that have already noticed it
 - b) ITCs can do a reset to get the table into sync
 - i) ODE rarely recommends a reset because it can hang the system
 - ii) For this table, it should reset itself in five minutes
 - iii) Hit reset, then synchronize
 - c) If districts are doing a prepare when this is resetting, can cause errors
 - i) Do first thing in the morning or at end of day
 - d) Table needs to be reset within the next couple of days
 - e) Question: Not used to looking at these tables, so if there is a red X does that mean I need to reset and synchronize?
 - i) Yes
- 6) Report Collector
 - a) FTE report adding Special Ed FTE to the report
 - i) If the student has a disability, the Special Ed FTE will be zero
 - ii) If student has an adjustment because of not having an IEP or time lapse of a valid IEP, the Special Ed FTE will be less than the regular FTE field
 - iii) If providing services and don't have the IEP reported, report a NIEP
 - iv) Probably won't be in the March #2, but will be in April payments
 - v) Question: if district doesn't have the IEP done within the 30 days, if they don't have an NIEP they won't get the weighted funding?
 - (1) Not talking about event types
 - (2) If the IEP is in place and student is receiving services they need to be reporting the IEP and will get the weighted funding
 - (3) If the student is a transfer in and the district is providing services but haven't adopted the IEP, they can report an NEIP
 - (4) Just having an ETR without the IEP being done doesn't warrant funding because the IEP has to be in place and services provided in order to receive funding
 - b) Finishing up Where Kids Count report and hope to release it this week
 - i) Different severity and results codes
 - ii) Waiting on finishing up documentation
 - c) Question: can you explain why we are looking at Where Kids Count before spring test administration?
 - i) The end date for WKC is March 19 for OGT and several other non-tested groups of students and April for the Next Gen and EOC
 - ii) All students will have end dates for WKC prior to the end of the year

- iii) Want to have reports for districts to verify before district personnel leave for summer
- iv) WKC doesn't have any direct tie to assessment results, rather where the students were enrolled during the window, so it can be verified independent of the test results being released
